

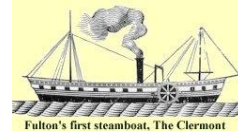
Transportation Timeline Scramble

- 1969:** – Apollo 11 lands on the moon and Neil Armstrong takes the first step.
- 1830:** – Peter Cooper designs and builds the Tom Thumb, the first American built steam locomotive operated on a common carrier railroad.
- 1903:** – The Wright Brothers fly the first manned airplane.
- 1807:** – Robert Fulton’s Clermont operates as the first steamboat with regular passenger service.
- 1869:** - The Transcontinental Railroad is completed on May 10 in Promontory Point, Utah.
- 1956:** – President Dwight D. Eisenhower signs the Federal-Aid Highway Act establishing the Interstate Highway System.
- 1804:** – The Lewis & Clark expedition leaves from St. Louis, MO.
- 1913:** – Henry Ford installs a moving assembly line in a Ford manufacturing plant.
- 1927:** – Charles A. Lindbergh makes the first solo, non-stop, transatlantic flight in the “Spirit of St. Louis.”

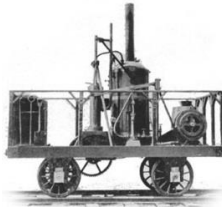
Transportation Timeline

1807: Robert Fulton operates the first steamboat with regular passenger service.

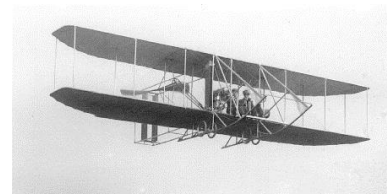
1830: Peter Cooper designs and builds the first American steam locomotive that operated



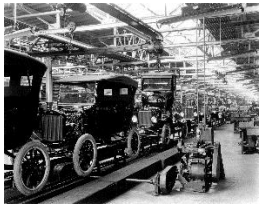
on a common carrier railroad.
